This exam does not require you to produce facts from memory, but rather you need to consider the thought process. This exam covers 4 timed sections, including verbal reasoning (65 multiple choice questions), Physical Sciences (77 multiple choice questions), Biological Sciences (77 multiple choice questions), and a writing pattern (2 essays, 30 minutes each). Verbal reasoning, physical sciences and biological sciences will be classified on a 1-15 point scale from 15 to the highest, and the writing pattern will score in an alphabetical order ranging from J-T to T to the highest. All multiple choice questions are worth the same, and the good news is there's no penalty for guessing. So no matter what happens, you can fill in all the answers regardless of whether you know the answer. The MCAT, or Medical College Admissions Test, is administered by the American Association of Medical Colleges, or AAMC. MCAT is a multiple choice standardized test used by medical institutions in the United States for the medical school application process. MCAT is managed through a computer interface and offered only in designated test centres. Most medical school applicants have a MCAT in the fall for their junior year of university education, but the timing when the applicant takes the test may vary depending on when they intend to submit an application. How do I sign up for MCAT? When should I register for MCAT? Registration for the MCAT must be completed in the U.S. (AAMC). Because testing locations and times are limited, registration can be full very early. Some states have test centers that fill in as long as six months before the testing date. It is important to plan ahead and choose a test date early. Some students travel to other states to see the MCAT when registering locally have been filled. What changes were made to MCAT in 2015? In 2013, AAMC discontinued the MCAT writing part, making the test completely multiple-choice. Those who did the test in 2014 only tested biological sciences, physical sciences, and verbal reasoning. In the coming years of 2015, the test will adopt a four-stage structure that includes biology and biochemistry, chemistry and physics, critical reasoning, and psychological and social biology. This last part introduces a new study substance in psychology and sociology, as well as neurobiology of sensory organs, emotions and cognition. The first administration of the new format will be in 2015 and will affect those applying to medical school by the year 2016 or later. All previous MCAT formats remain valid and acceptable to medical colleges after the change is made. What does the MCAT test do? What are the stages on THE MCAT? The current sections of MCAT are designed to test multiple topics in the sciences, as well as verbal reasoning and critical reading skills. There are three parts to MCAT: Physical Sciences, Verbal Reasoning, and Biological Sciences. The Physical Sciences section tests the materials of college general chemistry and college physics. The Verbal Reasoning section tests critical thinking skills based on the interpretation of scripture text. The Biology Sciences section tests biochemistry, college biology and some college biochemistry. Starting in January 2013, you may choose to take a non-dotted trial phase after the rest of the MCAT is completed. Whether or not the Trial section does not affect the MCAT score, and the section itself is not dotted; for testing questions that can be used in a later version of MCAT. The trial version is 45 minutes long. What is the MCAT format? How many questions are there in each section of MCAT? The official MCAT is given entirely through a computer interface. All questions are multiple-choice. The first part of the exam is the Physical Sciences section, followed by the Verbal Reasoning section, followed by the Biological Sciences section. The Physical Sciences section consists of 52 questions, the Oral Argument section consists of 40 questions and the Biological Sciences section consists of 52 questions. Parts of the Physical Sciences and Biological Sciences are often based on the interpretation and analysis of the experiment, while the verbal arguments usually come from social commentary or literature. The remaining 15% of the exam separate questions in science, interspersed with questions based on scripture passages. The sections of each section are usually followed by 4-8 questions, and the separate question sections of science will usually have 4 or 5 questions. The Verbal Reasoning section is entirely aisle and does not have discreet questions. How long is MCAT? MCAT usually lasts about four hours. 70 minutes to the Physical Sciences section, 60 minutes to the Verbal Reasoning section, and 70 minutes to the Biological Sciences section. This award includes the automatic transmission of scores to the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS), which is responsible for distributing scores to medical schools during the admissions process. No fee is available to AAMC students who demonstrate financial need. What are the 2014 MCAT dates? In 2014, mcat will be granted on the following dates: 23 January, 25 January, 22 March, 11 April, 24 April, 8 May, 17 May September 12, September 18, October 21, October 25 and November 7. Registration for each date closes approximately two weeks before the date of the study. Final test date for applying to medical school in fall 2015 12. On the day of the test, what should I bring to the MCAT? MCAT test centres are strictly regulated. The only thing that needs to be taken on the test day is a government-issued photo ID. You don't have to have any material for testing and anything taken will be placed in a cupboard outside the test area. Pencils and noise-cancelling headphones are also available. Can I use a calculator on MCAT? Is there an equation sheet on MCAT? Calculators are not allowed in the MCAT exam and no equation sheet is available. All calculations should be done mentally or manually, and all equations should be noted. The only resource provided during the test is a periodic table specifying the name, atomic mass and atomic number of each element. Should I guess at MCAT if I don't know the answer? There is no guessing penalty for the MCAT. Scores are based on the number of questions answered correctly and are not affected by missed or incorrectly answered questions. It's a good strategy to answer every question in the exam, even if you need to figure it out. After the test day, how soon can I see my test results? Score reports become available online through the AAMC website, about a month after the test date. Although the test is computerized, scores are not available immediately after the exam. Can I stop my MCAT score for sending it to medical schools? MCAT scores can't be hidden from medical colleges once they've been calculated. All MCAT scores that are on the register will be shared with the medical schools to which they apply. The only way to stop the test is to share it with these medical schools to deprive the exam score on the day of the test. This is done by selecting an option on one of the last test screens. By voiding the exam, the score is not calculated. Can I take back the MCAT? Students can take back MCAT to increase their scores. Re-take-off registration becomes available two days after the previous test and testing is available three times a year. Can I send certain MCAT scores to medical schools and not others? You can't select certain MCAT scores to share with medical schools. When submitting a medical school application, all and all MCAT scores that you have in the system will be available to the schools to which you apply.
